Casa is proof positive that helping others comes back to you in big blessings. A recent example is the shelter's newest renovations, provided by the Orange County United Way and Habitat for Humanity Orange County, partners in a new program to help nonprofit organizations throughout the county.

Casa was selected for the first project of "Building United," conceived by the two groups to improve the capacity of nonprofit service providers through reduced cost facility improvements and construction. Last month, two shelter bathrooms were remodeled and upgraded and a leaky roof was fixed – repairs that Casa Director Luciann Maulhardt says "may seem small to some, but it's a big deal to our agency, staff and clients. Those two bathrooms get a lot of use, and now that they're nice again, it's such an improvement." All the work was done by a team of Habitat for Humanity volunteers.


Kenny personally underwrites 100 percent of the costs. And, he calls on his good friends to provide

# A Day in the Life of a Casa Resident

Mornings at Casa begin at 6:30am. We wake up, get dressed, and have breakfast together followed by morning chores. Next is the Breakfast Club, where we talk about our counseling sessions, fears and hopes for going back home, and share struggles we are facing in making the changes to become more assertive and prepared for life outside of Casa. We set personal goals for the day and head back downstairs. Mornings continue with snack, recreation time on the Sports Court, and often volunteers who come with books, sewing supplies, or a walk to the park.

Each day at noon we sit down together for lunch. No one gets up until everyone is finished; we talk about our day and what is next. In the afternoons we have 2-3 group therapy sessions in art therapy, anger management, healthy relationships, self-esteem, and substance use. Each group provides time to share and learn skills that will prepare us for the situations that lie ahead with peers, parents, and our own personal struggles. Some days we have S.O.A.R., where we learn computer skills like how to create a resume'.

At 6:00 pm it's dinner time, a home-cooked meal that we sit down to and eat together. We talk about the events of the day and enjoy each other's company. Throughout the day, we get "Caught Ya" dollars when

they catch us being friendly or helpful. We spend them in the prize room or save them up to buy some gifts for our little brothers and sisters at home.

After dinner there are family counseling sessions, and we also get to play some foosball in the Rec Room, a board game, or shoot some hoops on the basketball court. Some nights we have a pass with our family – dinner or an overnight stay at home to practice what we've been working on as a family.



One last snack and then bedtime at 9 and lights are out at 9:30 pm. A day at Casa is structured – we know what to expect and look forward to our favorite youth supervisors and counselors coming in, saying hello, and asking about our day. As we prepare to return home, it's this structure and sense of community we want to incorporate into our daily lives with our families.

## Volunteer Students Are Making a Difference Every Day

Casa Youth Shelter enjoys the reputation of being one of the premier counselor training sites in Southern California. We work with many of the colleges and universities that surround us including: California State Universities at Long Beach, Fullerton, and Dominguez Hills, Cypress College, Long Beach Community College, Fullerton College, Azusa Pacific, Phillips Graduate Institute, Hope International, Pepperdine, Chapman, Loyola, Alliant and Vanguard Universities. Students come to us as undergraduate or graduate students. We are very fortunate to have students volunteering with us from some of the finest schools in the Southland.



Our Undergraduate Fieldwork program accepts 10 to 15 students each semester. Students volunteer approximately 10 hours per week. These students receive the same training as our Youth (House) Supervisors whom they work alongside. They help the residents get to their activities during the day, assure that the chores are done, handle crisis phone calls, make professional

referrals and, sadly, fill out child abuse reports. At the end of each semester we hire the very best 3 or 4 of them for our part-time paid positions.

Our Graduate Student Intern Program is the very foundation of our Counseling Services. These students provide 20 volunteer hours per week and they make a one year commitment. Students are trained in and provide crisis intervention, individual, family and group counseling as well as psychotherapeutic educational classes. Many stay on with us following the posting of their Masters, working hard to collect the 3,000 hours of experience necessary to qualify for their Marriage and Family Therapist (MFT) licensing exams.



## Being a Parent

The word “friends” describes many of the parent / child relationships we see at Casa. We hear adults say, “I’m not going to be as authoritative as my parents; I’m going to be a friend to my child”. Or we’ll see a single parent working 60 – 70 hours a week, their extended family a continent away. Who does this parent turn to for emotional support? Often, they turn to their children for their own emotional needs.

Many famous family therapists advocate a clear family hierarchy with strong generational boundaries. For parents seeking adult emotional support, we suggest churches and their attendant support groups, service clubs such as Rotary, Lions, Kiwanis, or even volunteering at local non-profits such as Casa Youth Shelter.

For parents needing direction in crafting relationships, Casa offers parenting classes in English and Spanish. These classes are weekly and run for 12 sessions. 
